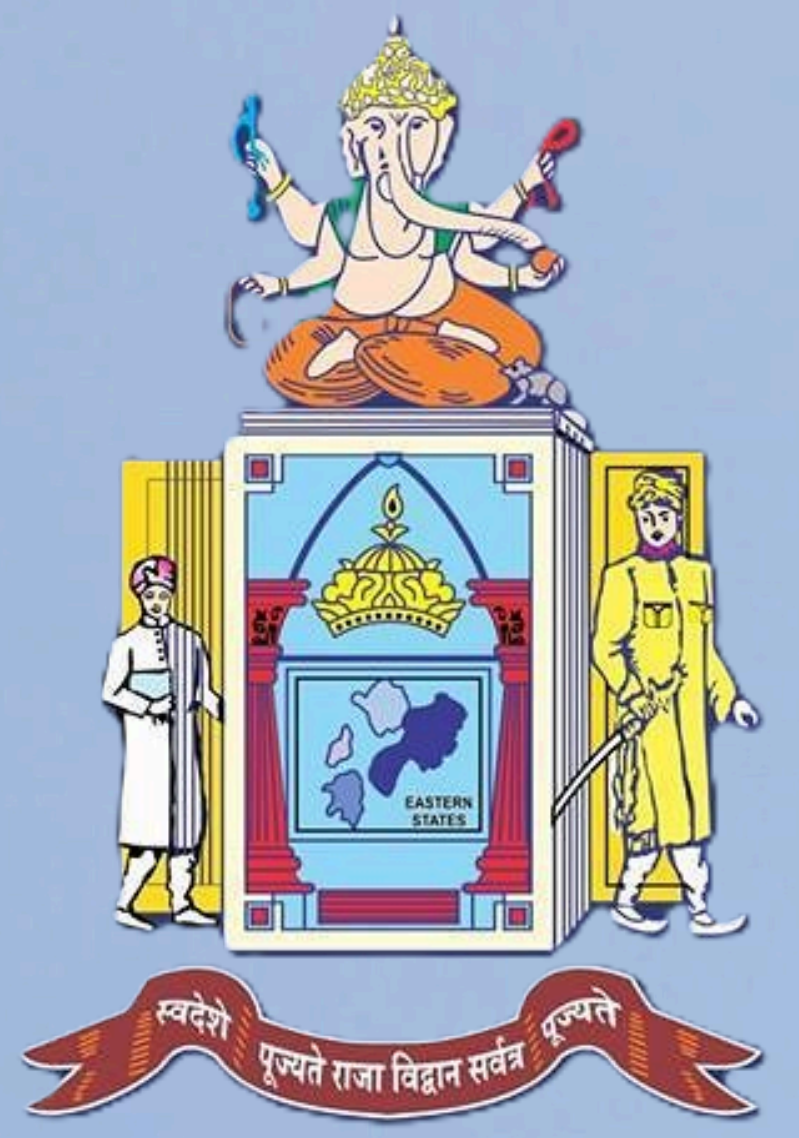

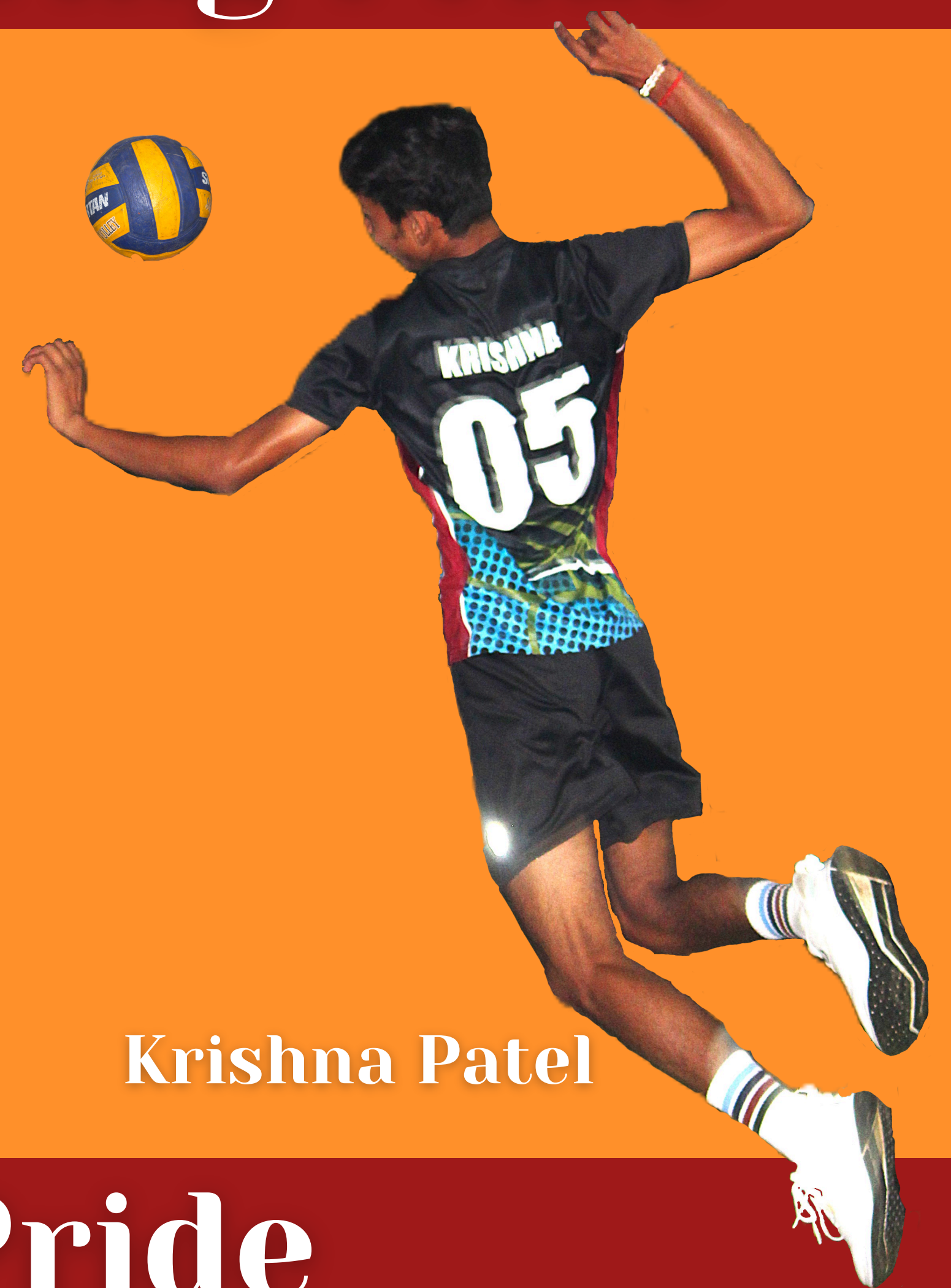

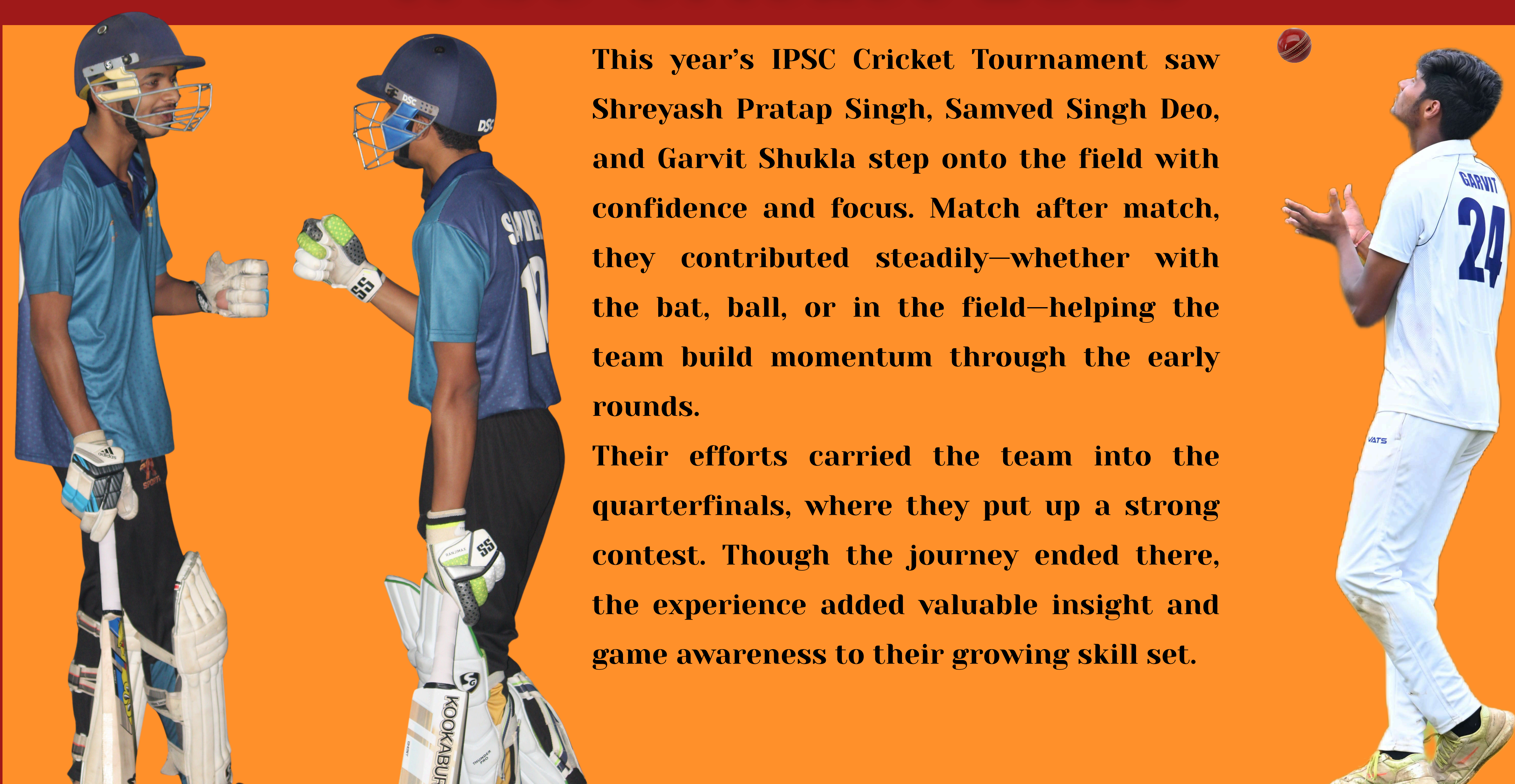


# The Chief's Cup: Triumph at Rajkumar College

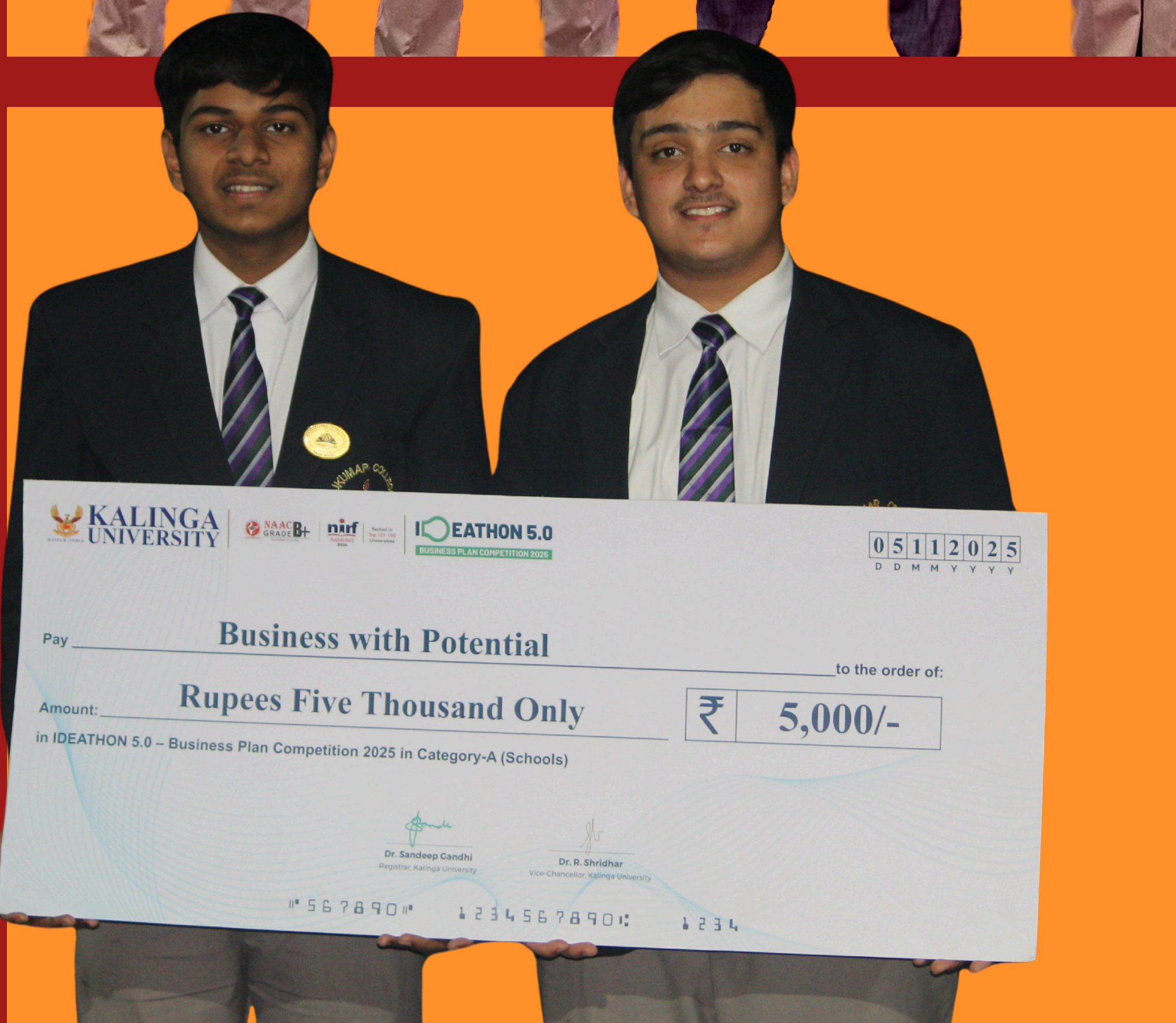
